

# PRE-K ENROLLMENT IS OPEN!

# Stop by the Broken Arrow Elementary Office and pick up a Pre-K enrollment form today! A few pre-qualifiers . . .

- You must live within the boundaries of the Shawnee Mission School District
- Student must be four-years-old on or before August 31 of the year in which they will attend Pre-Kindergarten
- be independent with toileting
- Students who are five years old on or before August 31 are not eligible for Pre-K.



#### If you are interested, here are some steps to determine your options:

- 1. Determine what school your child will attend. If you do not know, please use the "School Finder" provided on this webpage: https://www.smsd.org/about/boundary-maps.
- 2. Look at the Pre-K options available at the school buildings listed below. If a pre-kindergarten class is not offered at your child's school yet, there may be a school nearby that does offer the program. Please see the list of sites below.
- 3. Parents should complete the enrollment packet and bring it to the Pre-Kindergarten site to enroll. Parents should bring their child with them to enroll.

# In the 2019-2020 school year, Shawnee Mission School District is offering the following options for Pre-K:

- **No-fee half-day Title I Pre-K option** (Qualifications apply) offered at Comanche, Merriam Park, Rosehill, and Shawanoe.
- No-fee half-day grant-funded Pre-K option (Qualifications apply) offered at ApachelS, Bluejacket-Flint, Briarwood, Brookridge, Broken Arrow, Crestview, Highlands, Lenexa Hills, Rising Star, Roesland, Santa Fe Trail, and Shawanoe.
- **Tuition-based half-day Pre-K option** offered at Briarwood, Brookwood, Highlands, Lenexa Hills, Rhein Benninghoven, and Trailwood.

# Are You Aware of SMSD's Guidelines for **Healthy Choices?**

At the beginning of the 2017-18 school year, several elementary schools in the SMSD implemented new guidelines regarding daily classroom snacks, birthday treats, class parties, and special events. This decision was made after much thought and discussion at the building and district level. There are a variety of reasons why this change was made, the main one being to coordinate with our district's wellness guidelines on making healthy choices (in alignment with federal regulations). Other rationale for restricting treats at school include the following concerns:

- Allergies: Due to the increasing number of students with food allergies, schools have had to be extremely careful with any food items entering the school building. It is a safety issue that we need to take very seriously.
- Promoting Healthy Lifestyle: The federal Centers for Disease Control and Prevention estimates that one in six school-age children are overweight; triple the proportion in 1980. The agency has projected that one in three children born in 2000 will eventually develop a form of diabetes linked to being overweight.

Here's how the new guidelines will affect you/your student:

- Students may be allowed to bring a personal healthy snack daily at the discretion of the teacher. Students are encouraged to have water bottles in the classroom
- Classroom teachers will continue to recognize and celebrate student birthdays in special ways. Parents are welcome to send a non-food based item to share with the class if you would like on your child's special day.
- Class Parties (October, December, and February), curricular specific events, and class special events will be allowed to include food items which are purchased at a store, include a label from the manufacturer indicating ingredients and processing plant identification. We highly encourage teachers and room parents to serve healthy snack items.



- Food items brought to school provided outside the food service hours (10:15 am -1:15 pm), must be able to be consumed by all students and the food item(s) must not be sold to students or have money collected from students to purchase the food item(s).
- No homemade food items are allowed to be shared.
- Parents and guests may continue to bring outside food for lunch with their student (no sharing).

The purpose of these changes is to assure a school environment that promotes and protects students' health, wellbeing, and ability to learn by supporting healthy eating, physical activity and healthy choices. This change brings together current research to create guidelines that help us with healthy choices for all of our students.
